Our goal is to create an urban refuge while conserving our shoreline habitats and enhancing Daphne's most unique asset.

We have forged relationships between citizens and officials to identify funding opportunities, projects and sites which will enrich the Daphne bay front experience.

The Foundation's initial focus was acquisition of Village Point Park Preserve, which contains the historic Jackson Oak, the D'Olive Cemetery and former site of Native American activity, a French colonial settlement and the D'Olive Plantation.

Today the Foundation is committed to the maintenance and improvements of these areas. Expansion is on the horizon with wetland acquisitions and improved access to the entire stretch of waterfront sites.
